- 2. Clear outlook and philosophy in life.
- 3. Responsible attitude as an instructor.
- 4. Scientific mind in matters of technique.
- 5. Knowledge of the vital spots of human anatomy.
- 6. Unshakable integrity in political and financial dealings.
- 7. Dedication to spread the art of Taekwon-Do throughout the world.
- One who gains confidence from his seniors, is trusted by his fellow instructors, and is respected by his juniors.
